

FSH Perinatal Mental Health Services

- 1.Perinatal Mental Health Liaison Services
- 2. Perinatal alcohol and other drug outpatient (AOD) service
- 3. Mother and Baby Unit.





Perinatal Mental Health Liaison Service

- Team of senior mental health nurses, psychiatrists, registrars
- Supports Fiona Stanley Hospital (FSH) Women's and Newborn Services to identify mothers at risk of poor perinatal mental health outcomes.
- Assessment and care of referred women who are experiencing mental health difficulties during the pregnancy, or at risk of mental health difficulties.
- Interventions along perinatal pathway can include psychoeducation, psychotherapy, psychotropic medication, development of pregnancy care plans and liaison with FSH multidisciplinary team, community mental health, GPs and other community services including non-government agencies.
- Referring to and working with obstetric clinical psychology.

GPs – recommend referral to Perinatal Mental Health on obstetric referral

- Telephone advice/discussion
- Primary referral for serious mental illness (SMI) remains Childbirth and Mental Illness (CAMI) clinic at KEMH (more extensively resourced).



FSH Cockburn Health

- On the 25 March 2024, the State Premier entered into a three-year agreement to lease the building previously operated by Bethesda Clinic. This is a significant boost to public mental health services in the southern suburbs, and wider metro area.
- The now named FSH Cockburn Health is a standalone 75-bed inpatient facility which opened its doors on fifth August 2024
- The service is for voluntary patients and is not an Authorised hospital. This provides both an opportunity for innovation but also has its challenges.
- FSH Cockburn Health will provide an inpatient service for:

Women's Mental Health.

FSH Cockburn Health

Phased opening

- Women's bed over several months.
- Currently 15 beds open, will increase to 25 in mid-September.
- Growing to 75 beds by the end of the year...

eating disorder beds alcohol and other drug behavioural and withdrawal management beds will open.

- Later, outpatient services.
- Currently not taking referrals directly from GPs or community (Emergency Departments, mental health units)
- Will progress to state-wide, and community referrals

Criteria:

- Women (team acknowledges diversity in gender identification and sexual preferences)
- Mental health issues requiring inpatient care
- Voluntary patients that do not need a secure setting; physically stable
- Age 18-65
- Can engage in program
